What it Means for You



From 1 November 2025, the new Aged Care Act puts older people's rights at the centre of aged care. The Statement of Rights replaces the Charter of Aged Care Rights.

What this means for you

Your rights are now clearer and stronger than ever. You are at the centre of your care — your choices, your culture, your connections and your wellbeing come first.

Your rights

You have the right to:

- Make your own decisions and have them respected
- · Feel safe, included and supported
- Have your privacy and information protected
- Stay connected with your culture, community and loved ones
- · Receive safe, quality care that values who you are
